To Whom It may Concern

In accordance with N.J.A.C. 8:51, an environmental inspection was conducted on September 24, 2019 at the above referenced property by inspector Raziel Mia and Maria Cuevas-Greco. Testing of building components, by XRF analysis and soil samples were performed to determine if lead-based paint and other lead hazards exist. We have found hazardous levels of lead at the location(s) identified in the attached report. You are hereby required to remediate all lead hazards identified in the attached report within 90 days of the date of this notice.

Failure to remediate all lead hazards within that time frame will result in the initiation of legal proceedings against you and the levying of fines as set forth at N.J.A.C. 8:51-9.1. N.J.A.C. 8:51-6.2 does allow interim control measures to be used to remediate exterior lead hazards; however, all interior lead hazards shall be treated using abatement methods. Please review the attached report to determine if you can use interim controls on the exterior hazards found at your property. If interim controls on exterior hazards are permitted, you must use qualified contractors trained in lead-safe work practices to perform the work. The contractors must comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 8:51-6.2, a copy of which will be provided by the department of community affairs.

All lead abatement work undertaken in response to this Notice of Violation shall be performed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:17 Lead Hazard Evaluation and Abatement Code including, but not limited to:

- Filing a 10-day notice with the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) prior to commencement of work;
- Relocation of occupants and their belongings during performance of abatement work; and notifying this undersigned inspectors as to the property where the child will be located
- Hiring of an independent lead evaluation firm to conduct final clearance testing at the completion of lead abatement work

NOTICE OF VIOLATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE LOCAL BOARDS OF HEALTH

- At a minimum, the notice of violation given to the property owner or the family of the child with an elevated blood lead level shall contain all the information provided in <u>Appendix F</u>.
- No child specific information shall be mentioned on the notice of violation or on any other correspondence with the property owner.
